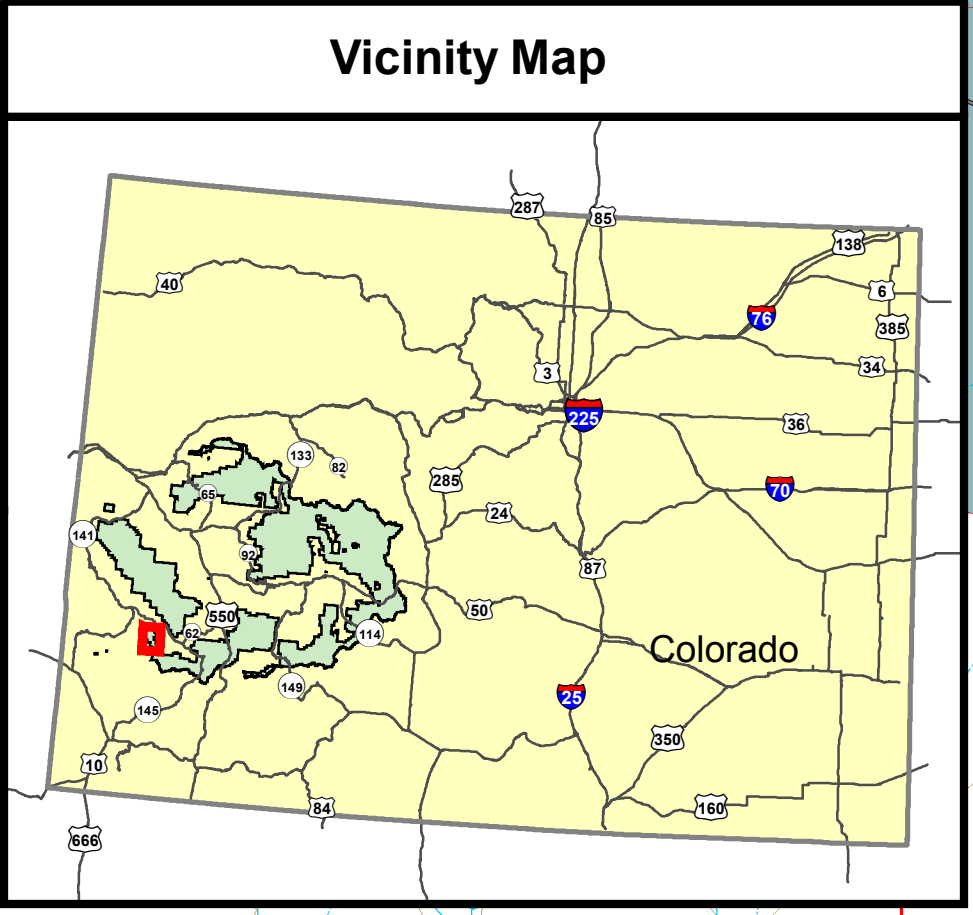
Map depicts proposed boundary for the Naturita Canyon Mineral Withdrawal Area as described in the San Juan Mountains Wilderness Act of 2018.

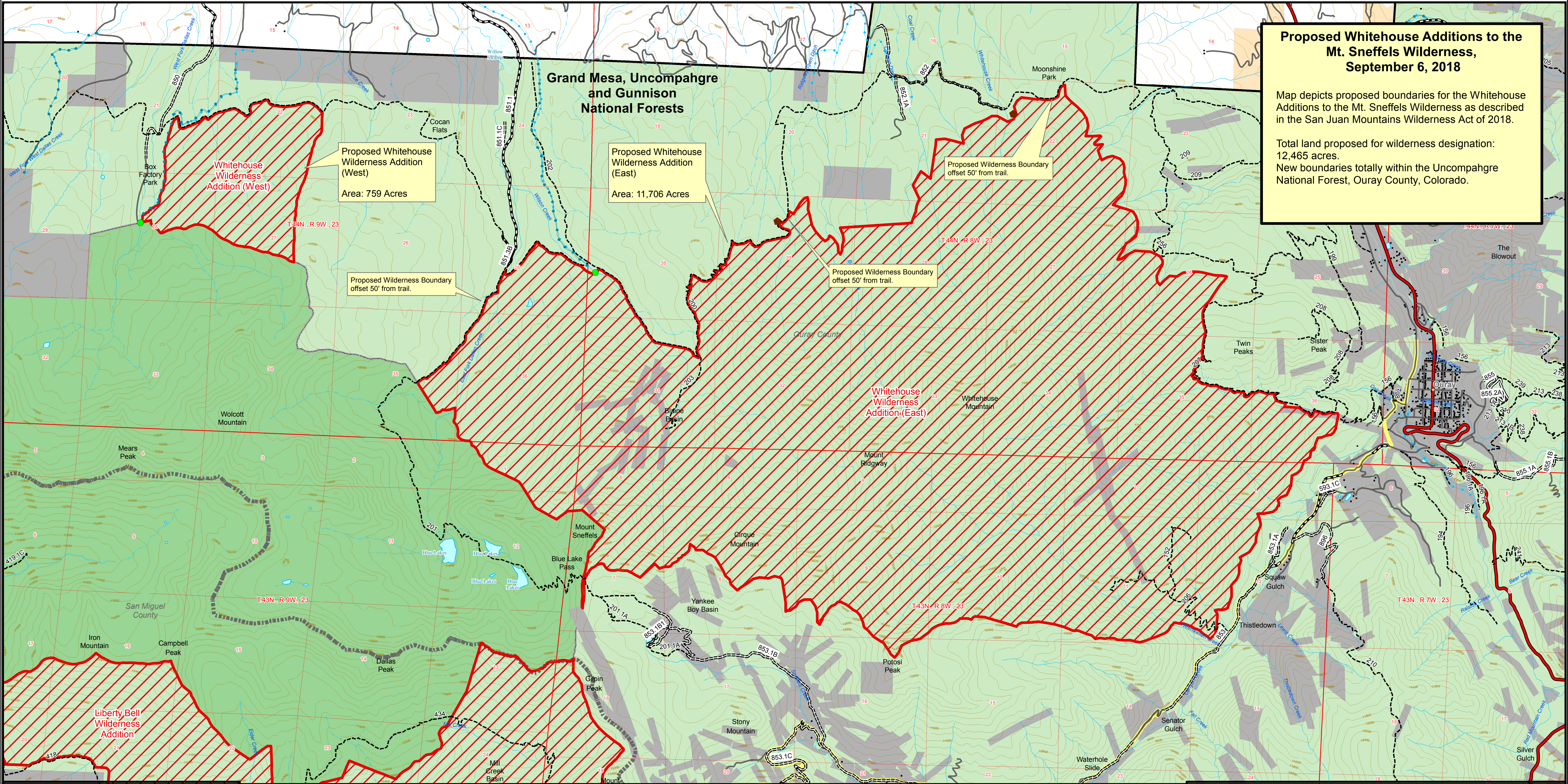

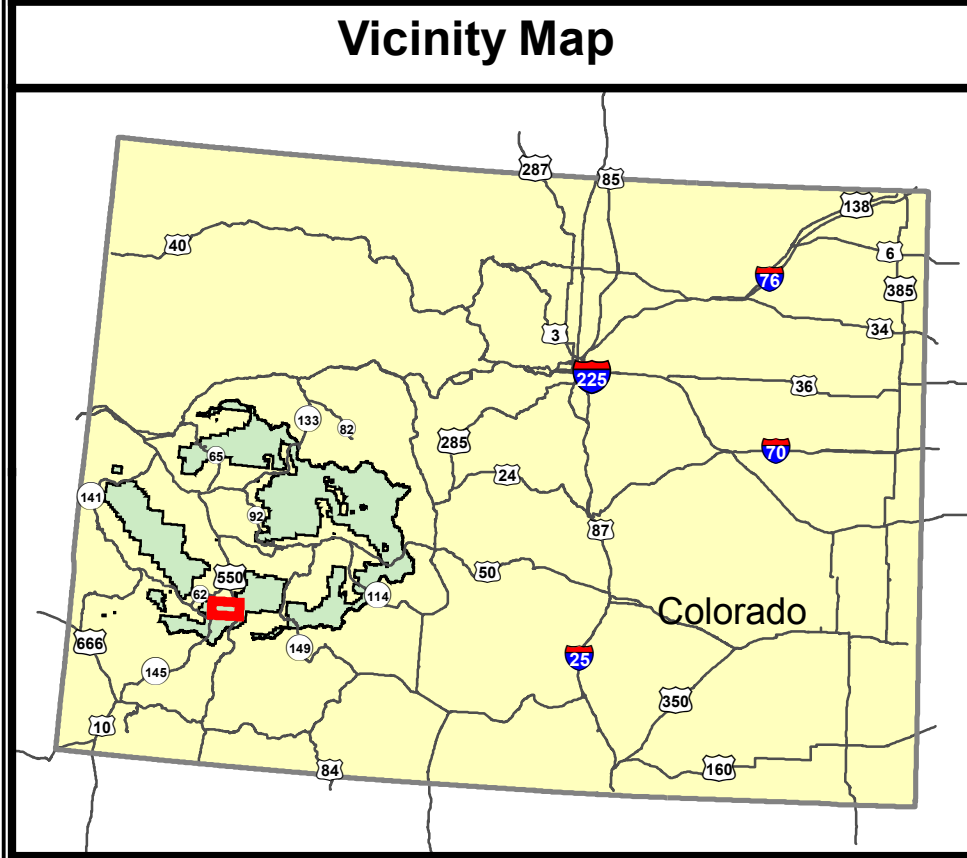

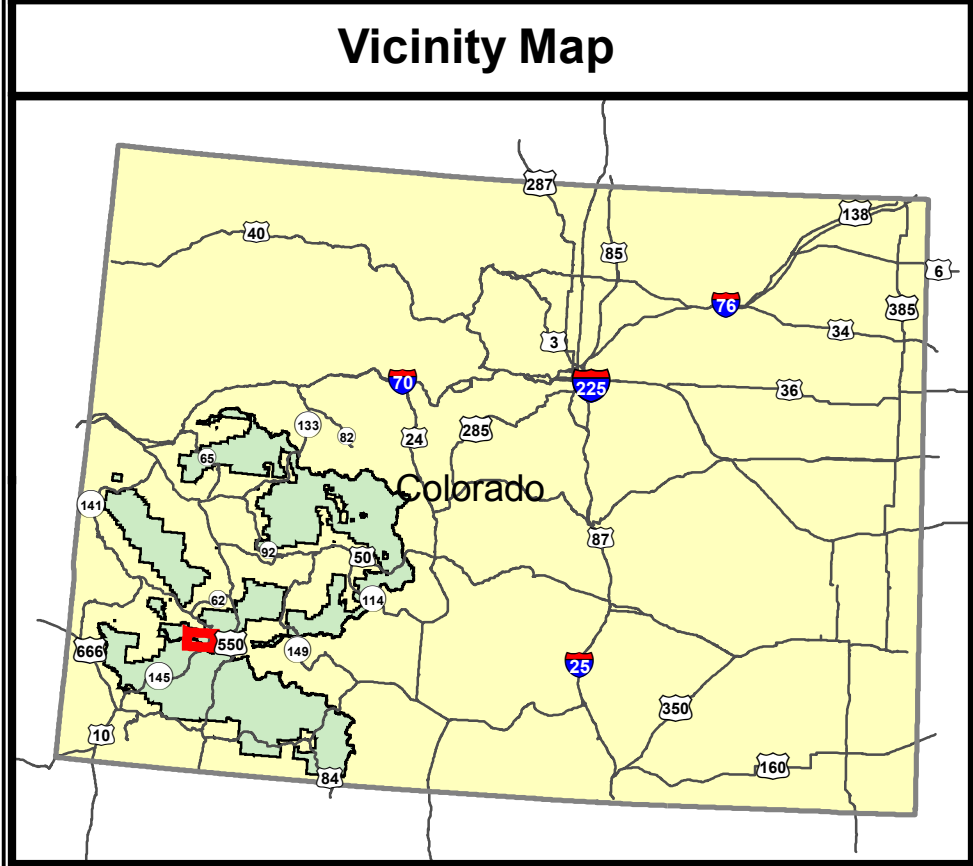

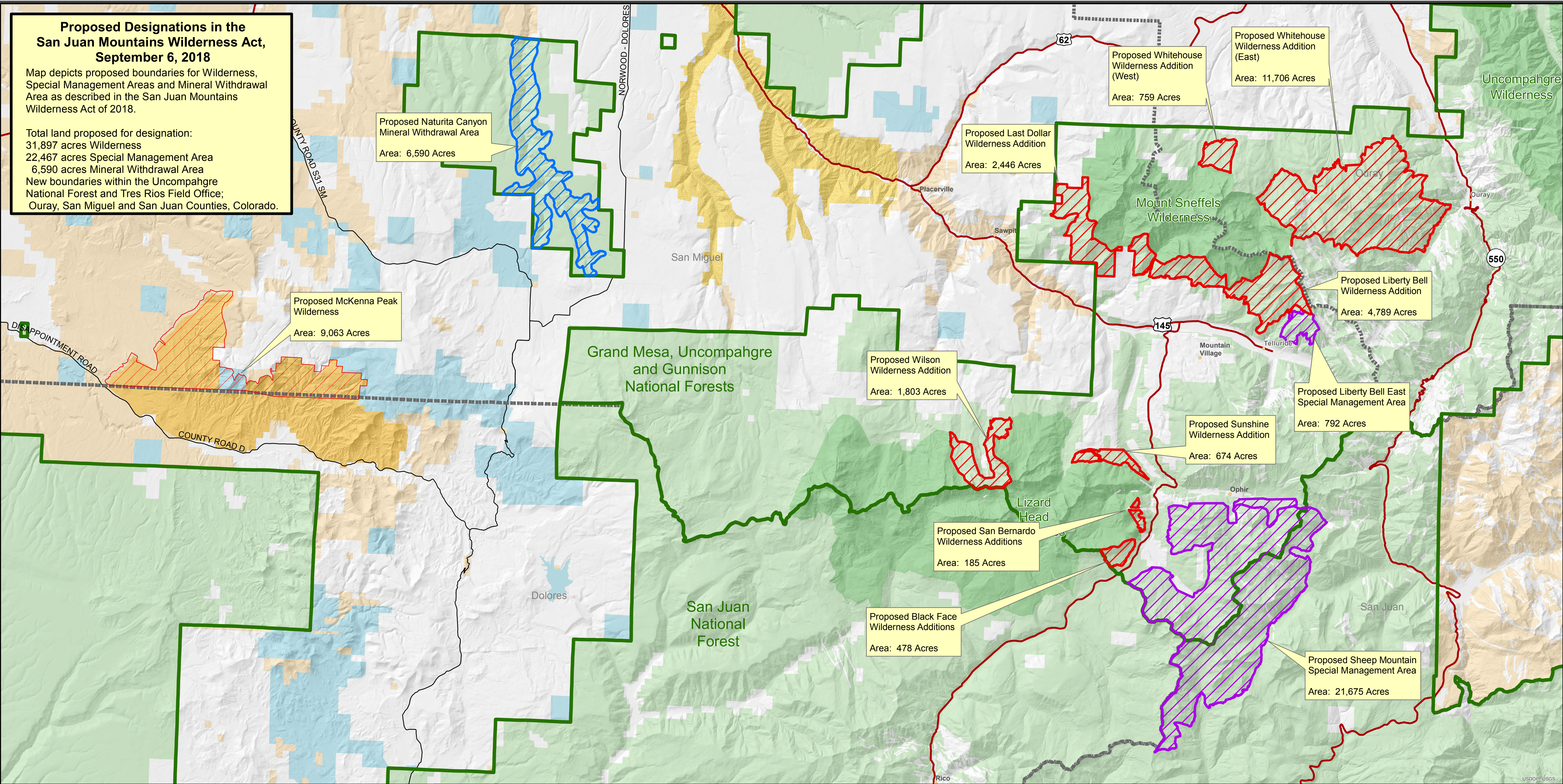

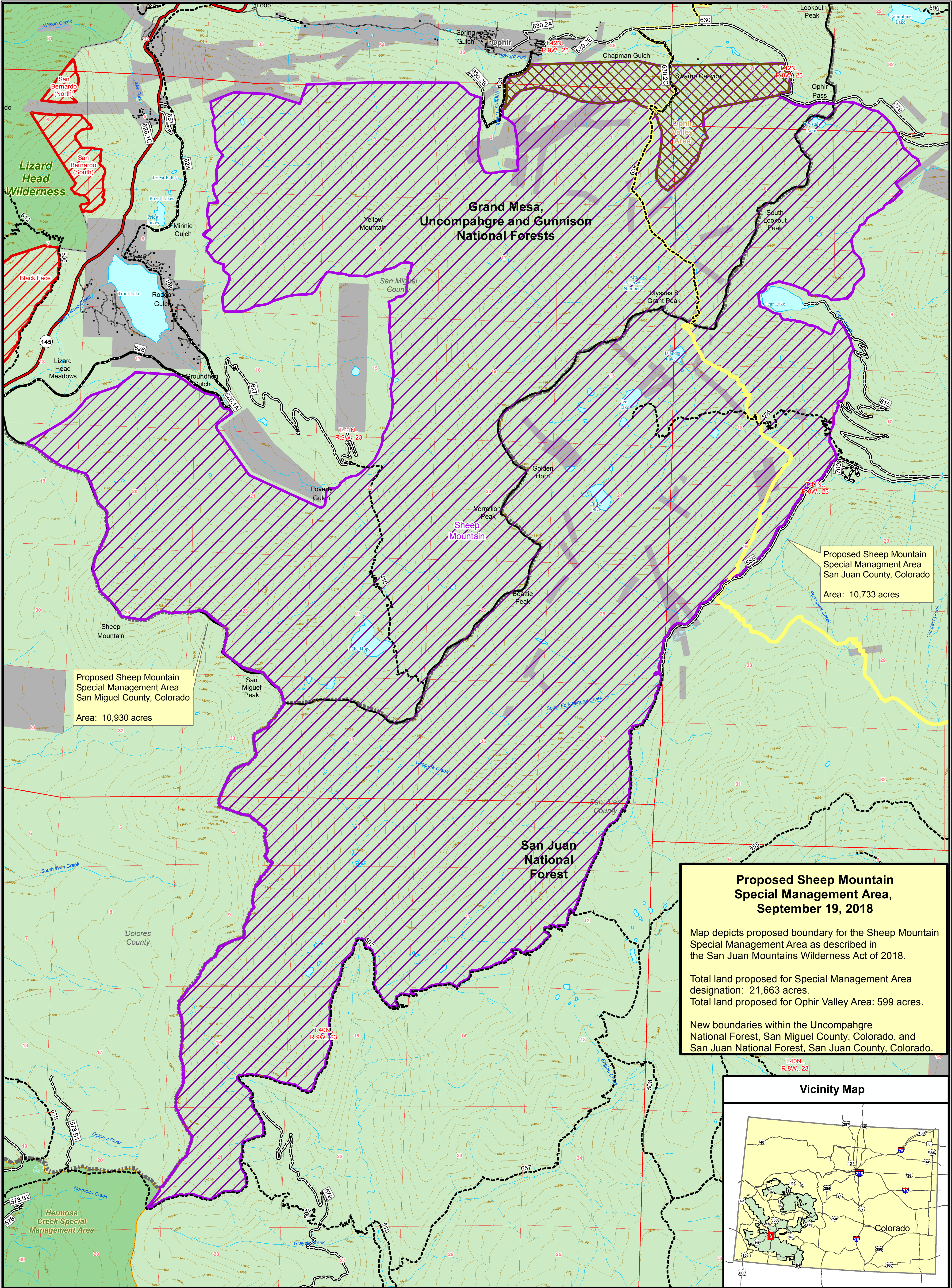

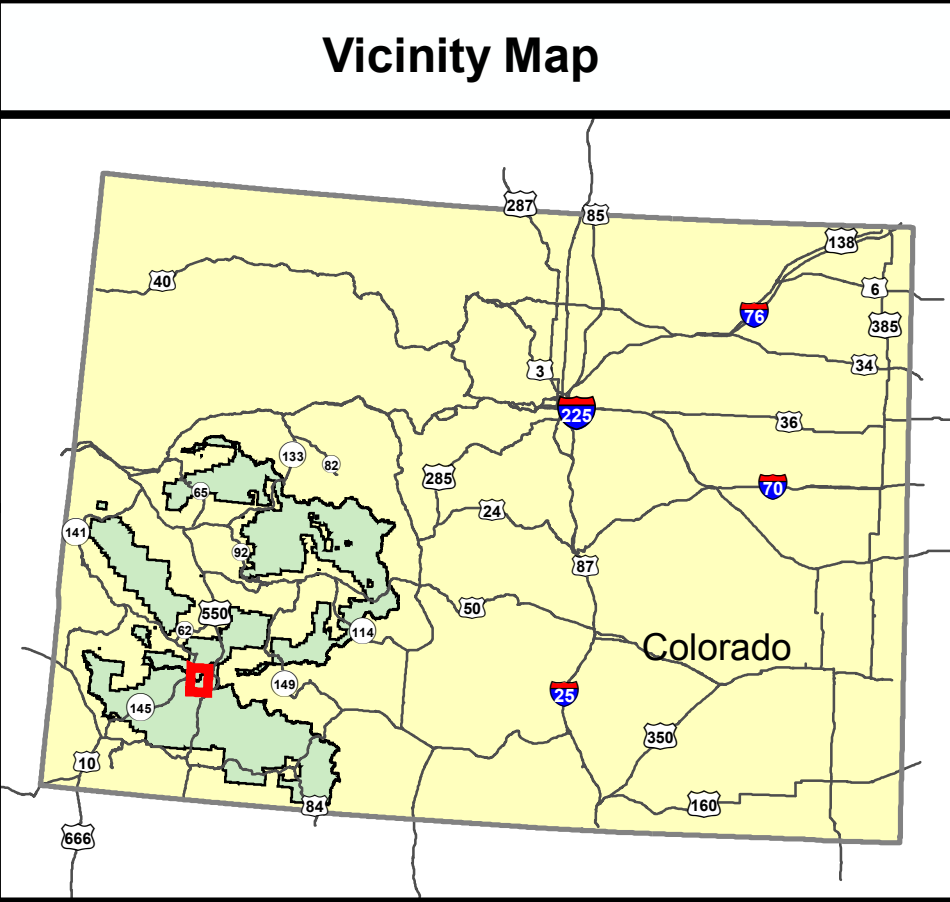
