## **A BILL**

To repeal certain executive orders targeting LGBTQI+ individuals.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

### **3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “No Place for  
5 LGBTQ+ Hate Act”.

### **6 SEC. 2. REPEAL OF EXECUTIVE ORDERS.**

7       (a) IN GENERAL.—

8           (1) NO FORCE OR EFFECT.—The Executive or-  
9       ders that target lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender,  
10      queer, or intersex (LGBTQI+) individuals, de-  
11      scribed in subsection (b), and any related or suc-

1       cessor Executive orders that similarly harm or limit  
2       the rights of LGBTQI+ individuals, shall have no  
3       force or effect.

4           (2) NO FUNDING.—Pursuant to article I of the  
5       Constitution, including the Spending Clause of sec-  
6       tion 8 of article I of the Constitution, no Federal  
7       funds may be used to implement, administer, en-  
8       force, or carry out those Executive orders.

9       (b) EXECUTIVE ORDERS DESCRIBED.—The Execu-  
10      tive orders referred to in subsection (a) are the following:

11           (1) Executive Order 14168 (90 Fed. Reg. 8615;  
12      relating to the Federal interpretation of sex),  
13      which—

14           (A) mandates discrimination against  
15      transgender, nonbinary, intersex, and gender-  
16      nonconforming individuals in the United States;

17           (B) could demolish protections for  
18      LGBTQI+ individuals in employment, edu-  
19      cation, housing, and health care; and

20           (C) refuses appropriate Federal identity  
21      markers to transgender, nonbinary, and  
22      intersex individuals.

23           (2) Executive Order 14183 (90 Fed. Reg. 8757;  
24      relating to reinstating and expanding the military  
25      ban on transgender servicemembers).

1           (3) Executive Order 14187 (90 Fed. Reg. 8771;  
2       relating to directing agencies to take action to pre-  
3       vent transgender health care from being provided to  
4       adolescents under the age of 19).

5           (4) Executive Order 14201 (90 Fed. Reg. 9279;  
6       relating to prohibiting transgender female students  
7       from participating on school sports teams aligning  
8       with their gender identity).

9           (5) Executive Order 14190 (90 Fed. Reg. 8853;  
10      relating to requiring schools to deny the existence of  
11      transgender people).

12   **SEC. 3. SAVINGS PROVISION.**

13      Nothing in this Act shall be construed to impair any  
14   constitutional authority granted to the President.
